#### In Demand

The deadline for applying to join Reception in September 2022 is January 15<sup>th</sup>. If the sheer volume of enquiries from a universally discerning group of parents and carers is anything to go by, we are expecting a high number of applications. In recent years those naming us as their 1<sup>st</sup> choice school has been humbling, with a five-year mean average of 250 applications per year for 30 places.

In recent weeks, Year 3 have immersed themselves in learning associated with climate change and sustainability. Other pupils from across the school are also keen to, in real terms, take action to reduce their carbon footprint.
