It is no exaggeration to describe the Year 6 scholars' assiduous approach and aspiration as humbling.
- Progress made by pupils from across the school.
- Both of the 2025 Sports Days were sublime evocations of Thomas Jones' pupils and families at their absolute best.
- Pupils excelling in violin, cello, piano and drama in 2025.
- Year 6's staging of Treasure Island in July a superlative rendition.
- Nursery's summer term Teddy Bears' Picnic.
- The landscaping of the raised beds in the Key Stage One playground a transformation affording opportunities for play and interaction.
- May's School Journey for Year 6 a magical experience archery, abseiling and raft building, and a unique sense of camaraderie, that only a residential visit of this kind can instil.
